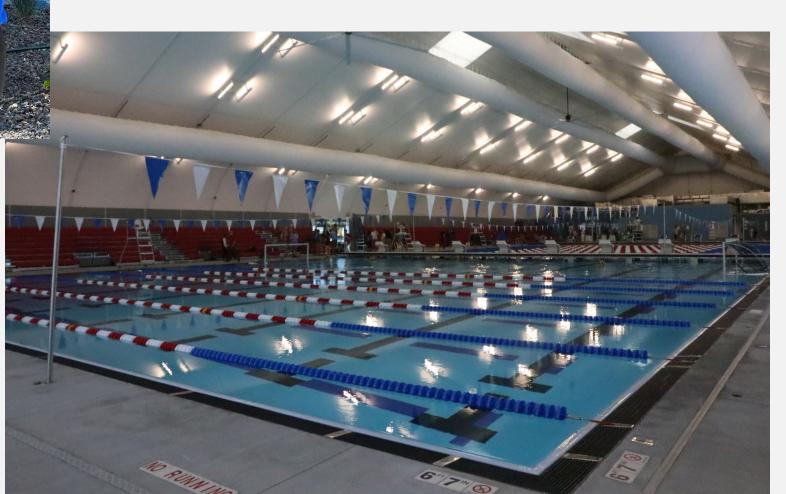

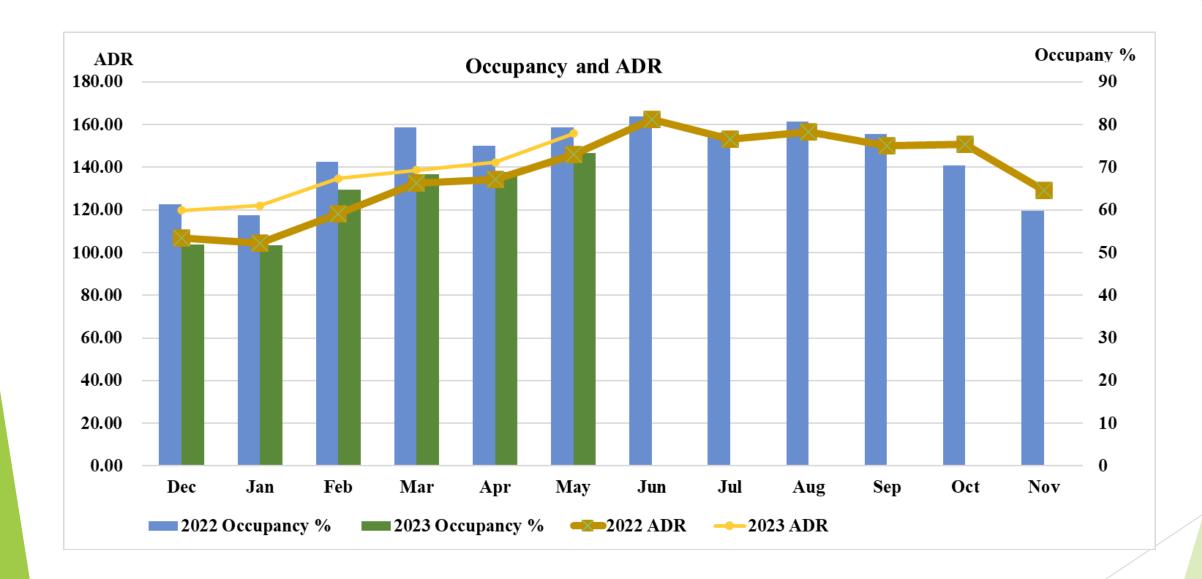

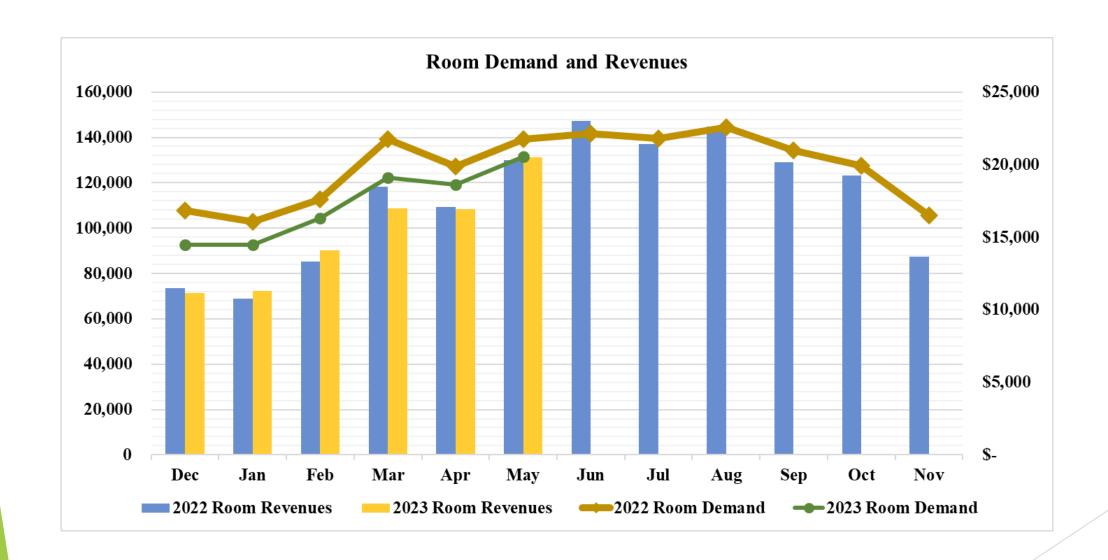
Hotel Statistics* - Occupancy and ADR

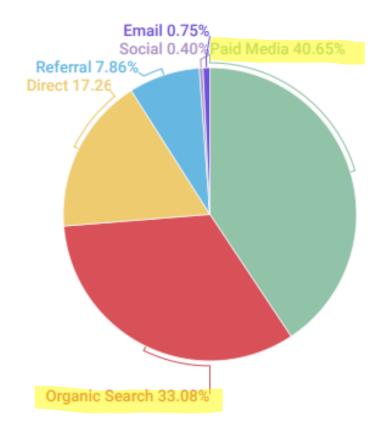

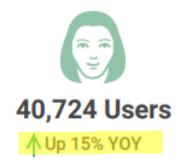
